### **CITY MANAGER:**

#### **Measure A:**

On Sunday, April 17<sup>th</sup> Measure "A" Supporters canvassed the Community. Numerous City Employees and Community Volunteers were present to provide information relating to the June 7<sup>th</sup> Ballot Measure and seek support.

### **PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:**

#### **Downtown Streetscape Project:**

Contractor Kendel Trent began the Streetscape Project on April 18<sup>th</sup>. He began on the block between Third and Fourth Streets with tree removal and demolition of curb, gutter and sidewalk. Demolition continued on Solano Street between Fourth through Fifth Streets on the south side of Solano. Once weather conditions improve, Trent Construction will begin curb and gutter construction with sidewalks to follow.

Trent Construction and the Public Works Department are working closely with local business owners providing construction progress updates.

## **POLICE DEPARTMENT:**

### **Patrol:**

In addition to responding to 181 calls for service, a total of 37 officer reports were taken and there were 82 officer-initiated incidents, including 52 traffic stops. Officers made 14 misdemeanor arrests and 4 felony arrests and issued 36 citations, of which; 14 were misdemeanors, 5 were felonies, 13 were infractions, 3 were parking-related and 1 was unclassified during the period of April 13, 2016 through April 20, 2016.

### **Community:**

The Corning Police Department will once again participate in the upcoming 11<sup>th</sup> Drug Enforcement Administration's Drug Take-Back Day.
