CITY MANAGER:

Waste Management Negotiations:

Waste Management provided a revised proposal for us to negotiate as part of our meeting on May 9th.

Recreation and Youth Enrichment Program:

I will be meeting with the Promise Neighborhood Grant Manager Dawna Holiday-Shchedrov on April 27th to discuss the Recreation and Youth Enrichment Program.

Pharmaceutical Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) Ordinance:

The County has been working to develop a Pharmaceutical EPR Ordinance for the Board of Supervisors' consideration for quite some time. Due to staffing shortages at County Counsel's office there has been a delay in proceeding. The Ordinance as proposed would require manufacturers that sell drugs in Tehama County to develop and fund a take back program for their unused drugs. The intent is to help prevent opioids from getting into the hands of unintended recipients and reduce the over prescription of drugs. I have a meeting with County Counsel on April 27th to see how the City of Corning would or would not be incorporated into this proposed Ordinance. I will provide updates to the Council as more information is available

FY 2018/2019 Budget Development:

City CPA Roy Seiler and I will begin to compile the FY 2018/19 proposed budget on April 30th.

Meetings:

I will be attending the Northern California Cities Self Insurance Fund (NCCSIF) Board of Directors meeting on April 26th.

CITY CLERK:

Corning Library Mural Dedication:

A Library Mural dedication ceremony hosted by the Corning Friends of the Library and County Librarian Todd Deck will be held on Thursday, May 10th at 4:00 p.m. They have invited the Mayor and City Councilmembers, Library Commission Members and City Staff to attend the event. Mayor Hatley will be present to speak and acknowledge all those involved in this project.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Corning Senior Center Repairs:

The Public Works Department received a quote from Streamline Engineering to prepare construction drawings for the Senior Center Repairs. The fee includes Structural Engineering services. The majority of the fire damage was to west and south walls and the roofing trusses. The damage to the west wall and the trusses compromise the structures stability and will not just need to be repaired, but replaced. The quoted fee is \$3,750 + any reproduction costs during the bidding process quoted at \$2.50 per sheet. This expense will be included in the insurance claim.

The City Attorney has prepared a contract document. Streamline Engineering currently has the document for review.

Department of Water Resources

On April 19th, the California Department of Water Resources released its update on winter rainfall for the Northern Sierra area. They report that current rainfall for this area is approximately 13 inches below the area's 'normal' average. The average is based on documented rainfall levels collected between 1966 through 2015 which is 51.8 inches.

City Hall Roof:

Contractor George Roofing is putting the final touches on the roof repair project and anticipates completing the project by Friday, April 27th. Building Official Dan Redding will inspect the project upon completion.

Corning Community Park; Skate Park

The playground shade structure (tarp) has been removed for repairs. Public Works anticipates that it will be about 3 to 4 weeks before the tarp is returned.

Community Event/Street Impact:

Saturday, May 5, 2018, Cinco de Mayo Celebration: Although there will be no road closures, please be aware that an event with large attendance is expected at the Corning Community Park (Skate Park) which may impact ease of road access not only on Toomes and Houghton Avenues, but the surrounding side streets as well. Emergency Personnel have been notified by memo.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 194 calls for service, a total of 39 officer reports were taken and there were 151 officer-initiated incidents, including 106 traffic stops. Officers made 19 misdemeanor and 6 felony arrests. Officers issued 27 citations, of which; 16 were misdemeanors, 9 were infractions, and 2 were parking-related during the period of April 18, 2018 through April 25, 2018.

Training:

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other Officer Field Training and Dispatcher Training is continuing. Our newest five officers participated in Radar Training this week.

Community:

The Peace Officer Memorial Service will be held on Wednesday, May 16, 2018 at High Point Assembly Church in Red Bluff beginning at 7:00 p.m.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

Call Volume:

Last week the Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 14 medical calls, 2 fires and 7 calls for public assistance. We also dispatched 7 medicals, 2 fires and 2 traffic collisions for Orland Fire and Capay Fire.

Training:

Training consisted of engine pump practice and donning an SCBA while being timed, 18 members participated for a total of 27 hours. There were also 4 Volunteers that did their practical training for their EMR (Emergency Medical Responders) Certificate over the weekend at the Fire Hall.
