Meetings:

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 201 calls for service, a total of 44 officer reports were taken and there were 121 officer-initiated incidents, including 67 traffic stops. Officers made 15 misdemeanor arrests and 5 felony arrests and issued 36 citations, of which; 21 were misdemeanors, 13 were infractions and 2 were felony during the period of March 30, 2016 through April 6, 2016.
