CITY MANAGER:

Food Truck Tuesday August 7th:

Food Truck Tuesday was a success thanks to everyone involved. A BIG thank you to the Public Works, Fire, Finance, and Police Departments for their hard work and dedication in support of this event. Numerous other community members, and council members including the mayor donated their time; I cannot thank you enough. The event would not be a success without each one of you. The smoke likely inhibited attendance; the degree to which is unknown.

Economic Development:

I will be attending a Tehama County Economic Development Meeting to discuss barriers and progress on August 10th. I will be addressing barriers to jurisdictional development including the lack of a local prevailing wage rate.

Proposition 47- Restore Grant Reporting Meeting:

I am meeting with River Cities' Counseling and the Center for Evaluation and Research regarding upcoming grant reporting for the Board of State and Community Corrections Proposition 47 grant that supports the Restore Program.

Recreation Department:

Molly Marcussen is currently evaluating software for the recreation program. The Fall course catalog is being updated. Additional social media outreach is also in progress.

Negotiations with Waste Management:

I will be meeting with representatives of Waste Management on August 17th.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Vandalism:

Vandalism continues to be a problem in the parks. All of the parks are hit in one way or another with intentionally broken sprinklers, tossed garbage cans and human feces. The park Crewmember is reporting that over the past few weeks, the Community Park (skate and soccer) has been a primary target for vandalism.

Waterline Extension:

Able Construction has completed trench paving repairs and intersection paving in those locations identified in the project plans. Water valves will need to be raised to grade before a final inspection can be scheduled. The Public Works Department anticipates that the contractor will be requesting a final inspection soon.

Meetings/Training:

City Engineer Robin Kampmann will be meeting with Ed Anderson and Public Works Director Dawn Grine on August 15th to review and be "brought up to speed" with past, recent and current City projects.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 211 calls for service, a total of 43 officer reports were taken and there were 185 officer-initiated incidents, including 110 traffic stops. Officers made 18 misdemeanor and 3 felony arrests. Officers issued 47 citations, of which; 17 were misdemeanors, 24 were infractions, 5 were parking-related, and 1 was unclassified during the period of August 1, 2018 through August 8, 2018.

Training:

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other Officer Field Training and Dispatcher Training is continuing.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

Call Volume:

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 15 calls for service last week. These consisted of: 11 medical aids, 1 traffic collision, 1 mutual aid fire, and 2 public service calls.

There were 12 calls dispatched for Orland Fire Department; these consisted of 8 medical aids, 1 traffic collision, 1 mutual aid fire, and 2 public service calls.

There were 4 calls dispatched for Capay Fire Department; these consisted of 4 medical aids.

Mutual Aid/Strike Team:

Engine 6 and the 3 CVFD members returned this week from working on the Carr Fire.
