### SCHEDULES:

**John Brewer:** On vacation from August 29<sup>th</sup> through September 1<sup>st</sup> visiting friends in Central Texas. An acting City Manager will be appointed before I depart.

### CITY MANAGER:

#### **Presentation to Exchange Club:**

I've been asked to make a presentation to the Exchange Club at their meeting on August 19<sup>th</sup>. I plan to update them on recent and upcoming projects and speak about this year's budget.

#### **Corning Community Park:**

Ed Anderson, Pat Walker, Steve Lindeman and I met with Landscape Architect Tom Phelps and the Landscaper on Thursday afternoon to discuss details of the landscape and irrigation plans. Ed spoke with the contractor and surveyor regarding the position of a storm drain.

I've asked John Stoufer to start planning the "ribbon cutting" event for Phase 1 of the Park. We're targeting Saturday October 19<sup>th</sup> at this time. We may need to limit the event to the Skateboard/Bike Park area to avoid trampling and damaging fragile recently seeded areas.

We received the Standard Agreement for the Rubberized Bark Grant, completed it and sent it back to the State. We're now eligible to get reimbursed for the rubberized bark we'll be using in the new park.

#### **Wood Waste Facility:**

We requested and were granted an extension to the September 1, 2013 deadline to generate a work plan to sample sediments and groundwater at the site. Our new delivery date is October 1, 2013. The delay should afford us the opportunity to review the results of the CalRecycle soil sampling results before preparing our Work Plan. We are now awaiting a proposal from Lawrence and Associates in Redding to prepare the Work Plan.

#### **Development Impact Fee (DIF) Updates**

Since the City Council Meeting on Tuesday, I've been working on updating the Parkland Development Fee. I also visited with City Engineer Ed Anderson regarding updates to the remaining DIF program. Ed will assist us with the update process.

## **PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:**

### **Corning Youth Soccer:**

On Thursday, August 14<sup>th</sup> I received a letter from Corning Youth Soccer League requesting to close off a section of Fig Lane from Pear Street to Fig Street for their annual Grand Opening. The date for the event is Saturday, Aug 17<sup>th</sup> from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Even though this was a last minute request, a maintenance worker will close that section of Fig Lane down because of the amount of children going back and forth from Olive View School to Maywood Junior High.

Corning Youth Soccer has been informed that future requests must be submitted to City Staff earlier to ensure Staff has adequate time to review and make any necessary staffing schedule changes.

### **Corning Community Park:**

Trent Construction is working on touch ups on the Skate Park portion. The City had Kanten Russell (Skate Park designer) from Stantec visit on Tuesday to inspect the Skate Park. Kanten will provide the City with a report on his findings. Sierra Landscaping is now starting work at the park. They are installing irrigation laterals right now and next week will start installing the irrigation mainline and booster pump. Tom Phelps (Landscape Architect) met with the owner of Sierra Landscaping to discuss any questions that associated with the plans.

### **Curb Painting:**

The Public Works Crew has been refreshing paint on the red curbs throughout town. They have been concentrating around the schools since they are starting next week.

## **POLICE DEPARTMENT:**

### **Patrol:**

In addition to responding to 184 calls for service, a total of 43 officer reports were taken and there were 151 officer-initiated incidents. Officers made 14 misdemeanor and 5 felony arrests, 81 traffic stops and issued 26 citations of which 2 were felony, 20 were misdemeanors, 2 were infractions, 1 was parking and 1 was unclassified during the period of August 7, 2013 through August 14, 2013.
