CITY MANAGER:

City Water & Sewer Debt Service:

City Staff is currently working with Mark Northcross and Mike Meyers of NHA Advisors to explore possible savings options by refinancing the 1999 A&B, 2005 COP and 2005 USDA Water & Sewer Debt Service loans. NHA Advisors believe such action will save the City a significant amount money without increasing the debt term.

Elections:

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Streetscape Project Update:

The Contractor has begun sidewalk demolition on the south side of Solano Street between 6th and West Streets. New sidewalks and tree wells will be installed to the west end of the Super Shopper Auto Dealer. Once the Contractor begins installation of the new sidewalk on the south side of Solano Street he will then begin sidewalk demolition on the north side of Solano.

During the paving of Solano Street, the crosswalk located at the 4th and Solano Streets intersection on the north side of Solano was damaged and then repaired by the Contractor. The Contractor has been notified that the red-brick coloring is separating from the concrete.

City Council Chamber/Corning PD Entryway:

The summertime heatwave had caused the red tiles outside the City Council Chambers and Corning Police Department entrance doorways to buckle and become damaged. Public Works will seek quotes to make repairs.

PG&E:

PG&E has informed the Public Works Department that they will be in town this week performing a routine Leak Survey of their main lines. Their vehicles will be marked with the PG&E logos.

City Pool:

The City Pool is now closed for public swimming. Lap Swim will continue until September 2nd.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 230 calls for service, a total of 37 officer reports were taken and there were 96 officer-initiated incidents, including 42 traffic stops. Officers made 11 misdemeanor arrests and 1 felony arrest. Officers issued 23 citations, of which; 11 were misdemeanors, 1 was a felony, 4 were infractions, 1 was animal-related and 7 were parking-related during the period of August 10, 2016 through August 17, 2016.

Department:

The installation of the security gates at the Police Department parking lot has been completed. This project included shoring up of the existing fence, installation of an electric remote operated gate, as well as a pedestrian gate, lighting of the area and a security camera. The majority of monies for this project were provided through a Homeland Security Grant.
