CITY CLERK:

Elections:

Currently two individuals have pulled and returned candidate papers to run for City Mayor, those individuals are Tony Cardenas and Douglas Hatley Jr. Five individuals have pulled candidate papers for City Council; only one has returned the papers for official filing, that individual is Jose De Jesus Valerio Martinez "Chuy". Candidate papers were pulled by Laura Calkins for City Treasurer and Lisa Linnet has pulled and returned for official filing her papers for City Clerk.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Streetscape Project Update:

The Contractor will begin sidewalk demolition on the south side of Solano Street between 6th and West Street mid-August. New sidewalks and tree wells will be installed to the west end of the Super Shopper Auto Dealer. Once the Contractor begins installation of the new sidewalk on the south side of Solano Street he will then begin sidewalk demolition on the north side of Solano.

2016 Street Project:

Paving has been completed on the following:

- East Street from Solano to North Street;
- Intersection of Hwy. 99W & Solano Street;
- Pear Street (one block by Woodson Park);
- North Street (one block by the Bus Barnes);
- Yolo Street (one block) between East Street & First Street

All that remains to complete this project is the traffic striping.

Tehama County Groundwater Sustainability Agency Groundwater Commission:

The newly formed Groundwater Commission met for the first time on August 2nd. There are currently six appointed Commissioners each one representing their agency; the Cities of Corning, Red Bluff and Tehama, the El Comino Irrigation District, the Los Molinos Community Services District and the Rio Alto Water District. The Groundwater Commission is now seeking applications to fill the five remaining positions. The request for applications will be published in the Red Bluff Daily News and the Corning Observer. Applications must be received by the Tehama County Public Works Department located at 9380 San Benito Avenue, Gerber CA 96035 no later than 4p.m. on September 2, 2016.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 210 calls for service, a total of 30 officer reports were taken and there were 72 officer-initiated incidents, including 19 traffic stops. Officers made 8 misdemeanor arrests and 1 felony arrest. Officers issued 15 citations, of which; 7 were misdemeanors, 2 were infractions, and 6 were parking-related during the period of July 27, 2016 through August 3, 2016.
