CITY MANAGER:

Upcoming Staff Absences:

City Manager John Brewer will be out of the office beginning Wednesday, March 18th and returning on Tuesday, March 24th.

Mid-Year Budget Review:

We will present the Mid-Year Budget Review at the February 24th City Council Meeting.

Streetscape Project:

We are meeting with Kelly Zolotoff of Caltrans District 2 next Thursday to make sure we are all on the same page regarding the required paperwork to ensure our Project can be funded by California Transportation Commission (CTC) immediately after gaining Division of State Architect (DSA) approval. City Engineer Ed Anderson and I plan to hand deliver the updated Streetscape Plans to DSA in Sacramento to ensure that we through their plan check process this cycle.

Rogers Theater Restoration:

Building Official Terry Hoofard is working preparing and setting forms for the next concrete pour for the floor replacement.

SW Quadrant Waterline Extension Project:

We received and recorded the signed "Annexation Agreement" document from the Lopez family. We provided a copy of this document to County Planning Director Sean Moore in his capacity as the Tehama County LAFCo Secretary. Sean provided an email stating that the LAFCo "Conditions of Approval" were now satisfied and the Waterline Extension Project could proceed.

Now Pilot's Engineers (Broadbent) can meet with Tehama County Public Works to ascertain their requirements for the work that'll occur in the County Road Right-of-Way.

Tehama County Air Pollution Control District-Indirect Source Advisory Committee:

As a member of the Indirect Source Advisory Committee, I attended a meeting on Wednesday afternoon in Red Bluff to review applications for funding of mitigation projects by the Air Resources Control District. There were two applications for funding presented and the Committee opted to recommend they both be funded. The two projects were from the Tehama County Transit Agency in the amount of \$13,987.71 for new bus shelters for the TRAX Bus Line, and from the Air Pollution Control District to establish a "Woodstove Replacement Program"

I attended a lunch meeting with County Administrator Bill Goodwin, Red Bluff City Manager Rick Crabtree and County School Superintendent Charles Allen on Thursday, February 19th in Red Bluff.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 158 calls for service, a total of 24 officer reports were taken and there were 113 officer-initiated incidents. Officers made 13 misdemeanor and 0 felony arrests, 53 traffic stops and issued 33 citations of which 0 were felony, 17 were misdemeanors, 10 were infractions, 4 were parking-related and 2 were animal-related during the period of February 11 2015 through February 18, 2015.
