Sacramento Valley Division, League of California Cities Membership Meeting:

CITY MANAGER:

Solano Streetscape Project:

John Stoufer and I reviewed the APE (Area of Potential Effects) Map prepared by Sean Harrasser of the Tehama County Transportation Commission regarding the NEPA document for our Streetscape Project. We suggested some minor revisions and Sean forwarded the document to Caltrans in Redding for their approval.

March 6th Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) Operations Contract Meeting:

Pat Walker and I have scheduled to meet with William Mertes, Vice President for American Operations of the Severn Trent Company. Red Bluff City Manager Rick Crabtree and Public Works Director Bruce Henz will also be attending that meeting.

Ladder-board Directional Signs:

I sent an email to Mr. Kevin Sharrah who crafted the ladder-board directional signs in front of Taco Bell and Love's Travel Center. He had previously agreed to repair the signs that are peeling. I asked him to contact Nash's Olive Oil regarding revising their sign message at the same time as the repairs are completed.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Spring Bloom Event:

Lucero Olive Oil has requested authorization from the City to detour traffic for their Annual Spring Bloom Event on Saturday, May 10th. As in the past, they would like to close Loleta Avenue to **one-way traffic only** accessing from Hwy.99 W to Toomes Avenue eastbound. Westbound traffic from Toomes Avenue would be routed south towards South Avenue. This traffic route alteration would take place between the hours of 9:00 a.m. to approximately 5:00 p.m. on the day of the event (Saturday, May 10th) only.

Clark Well:

Public works is still waiting on parts to fix the backflow valve on the Clark Well. If we receive the parts early next week we should have the Well back online by Friday at the latest.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 193 calls for service, a total of 49 officer reports were taken and there were 143 officer-initiated incidents. Officers made 21 misdemeanor and 5 felony arrests, 74 traffic stops and issued 57 citations of which 1 was a felony, 38 were misdemeanors, and 15 were infractions during the period of February 19 through February 25, 2014.


