### **HOLIDAYS:**

**Presidents' Day:** Monday, February 20<sup>th</sup> City Hall, the City Finance Department, and the City Corporation Yard (Public Works) will be closed.

### **CITY MANAGER:**

#### **City Manager's Department Meeting:**

I will be out of the office February 6-10<sup>th</sup> attending a City Manager's Conference.

#### **Kaufman Building:**

On January 30, 2017 the City received payment in the amount of **\$12,293.80** from Farmers Insurance Co. (Kaufman Building owner's insurance provider) for costs incurred as a result of the fire on October 19, 2016. Reimbursable charges (from date of fire only) on the invoice included: perimeter fencing and replacement fencing (resulting from fire damage) costs; Walberg, Inc. for initial emergency demo service; Green Waste of Tehama for disposal of initial safety demo waste; and charges for approved Staff wages for time expended to coordinate initial safety cleanup, assessment of the site following the fire, and securing the perimeter during and immediately following the fire.

### **PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:**

#### **Water Tower:**

AT&T provided an inspection crew on Thursday to certify the newly attached lighting fixtures. A welding certificate will be produced and submitted to the Building Official in order to finalize their water tower lighting and painting improvements project.

#### **Corning Little League:**

The Director of Public Works will be attending a Little League Meeting to meet with Board Members regarding a lumber donation from Sierra Pacific for repairs to be made to the Clark Park Bleachers. The meeting will be held at Corning Round Table Pizza on Thursday at 6 p.m.

### **POLICE DEPARTMENT:**

#### **Patrol:**

In addition to responding to 205 calls for service, a total of 26 officer reports were taken and there were 84 officer-initiated incidents, including 29 traffic stops. Officers made 5 misdemeanor arrests and 0 felony arrests. Officers issued 7 citations, of which; 6 were misdemeanors, 1 was an infraction during the period of January 25, 2017 through February 1, 2017.

**Community:**

Several City Departments are involved in property clean-up within the City. At this time, the Police Department is charged with the vehicle abatement portion of property clean-up. For the month of January, private property statistics are as follows: 9 letters sent, 2 vehicles towed, 7 vehicles corrected by owner, 8 hours spent on abatement. In addition, other times and energies were directed to public vehicle abatements as well.
