POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 233 calls for service, a total of 29 officer reports were taken and there were 99 officer-initiated incidents, including 27 traffic stops. Officers made 8 misdemeanor arrests and 5 felony arrests. Officers issued 16 citations, of which; 11 were misdemeanors, 3 were infractions, 1 was parking-related, and 1 was unclassified during the period of June 28, 2017 through July 5, 2017.
