CITY MANAGER:

FY 2017/18 Budget:

The proposed FY 2017/18 is being printed and the corresponding staff report is being drafted for dissemination.

Retail Sales of Marijuana:

At a Special City Council meeting held on Tuesday, May 30th, the City Council directed Staff to develop regulations and ordinances to allow for a dispensary. They also directed Staff to draft regulations to ban outdoor personal grows within the City.

Encroachment Permit:

MJ Shelton General Engineering, Inc. applied for an Encroachment Permit so that they may perform drain line replacement of portions of Bell Carter's olive waste drain lines located within the City Limits of Corning. They anticipate beginning this project on June 12th and should be completed within two weeks. Project Scope:

- 2nd Street between Marin and Yolo Streets
- Midblock 4th Street between North and Tehama Streets

Public Works Crewmembers:

Effective May 30th, Public Works Crewmembers will be on summer hours of operation. Their work day will begin at 6:00 a.m. and end at 2:30 p.m. The Meter Reader/Maintenance Worker will continue his working hours of 8:00 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. Summer hours will end the first workday after Labor Day Weekend.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 202 calls for service, a total of 24 officer reports were taken and there were 70 officer-initiated incidents, including 28 traffic stops.
