CITY MANAGER'S NOTES:

City Manager Out of Office:

I'm scheduled to take a week's vacation the third week of April. I'll be out of town from the 13th thru the 16th, then around the house the remainder of the week and returning to work on April 22nd.

Also, my Wife and I normally take our annual vacations in late September. We use this schedule to avoid the crowds that usually affect summer travel. This year, we'll modify our plans in order to attend my Stepson's wedding in Colorado Springs in September (21st), and some accompanying time off. For that, I'll ask the Council's authorization to be absent from the second September City Council meeting (9/24).

Safe Routes to School:

Ed has been working with Precision Surveying to complete the design of the curb, gutter and sidewalk improvements for the Safe Routes to School Project on Fig Lane east of Marguerite Avenue. We hope to have the proposed Plans and Specifications available for Council consideration and authorization to seek bids at either the March 26th or April 9th City Council meetings.

Airport Use Inquiries:

We've posed questions regarding the two land use inquiries (Aircraft Assembly & Glider Operations) we have regarding new/expanded airport uses to the FAA via email. I followed up the email with a phone call to assure that our FAA Representative received the email.

Airport Fence:

On Wednesday Ed Anderson and I drove the perimeter fence boundary and spoke about the details of the fence alignment and design. We forwarded Ed's Engineer Services Proposal for Fence Design Engineering to FAA for their concurrence and authorization to proceed.

Meeting with Mike Colbert-USDA

Ed Anderson, Pat Walker, Lee Blaylock, Kendel Trent and I met at the Clark Park Well to fulfill USDA's need for an 11-month check of the well, pump and equipment. The point here is to note and correct any shortcomings prior to the one-year expiration of the construction warranty. We did discuss the potential need for a minor sanitary seal repair at the wellhead. Kendel Trent has scheduled that to be completed on Thursday 3/14. We also spoke about an electronics issue that is causing the generator to cycle on and off more often than necessary for testing. That matter is being addressed by our pump/well consultant, Win Benbow.

Phase 1 of the new Park:

Ed Anderson has sent out emails seeking potential "Pre-Construction Meeting" dates to Kendel Trent, Herb Votaw of Rolls, Anderson & Rolls, Kanten Russell of Stantec, Landscape Architect Tom Phelps, John Stoufer, Pat Walker and myself. All are encouraged to respond regarding their respective dates available.

Minor Accident at City Corporation Yard:

Last Friday (March 8, 2013) minor damage occurred to the Fire Department "Squad" vehicle when the raised hood collided with a shop bay door; there were no injuries. Chief Spannaus is getting the hood repaired.


Railroad Track Replacement:

POLICE DEPARTMENT:**Patrol:**

In addition to responding to 195 calls for service, a total of 32 officer reports were taken and there were 102 officer-initiated incidents. Officers made 15 misdemeanor and 6 felony arrests, 67 traffic stops and issued 22 citations of which 15 were misdemeanors, 6 were infractions and 1 was unclassified during the period of March 6 – March 13, 2013.
