### **CITY MANAGER:**

#### **Food Truck Tuesday Line-Up:**

The final dates and entertainment for the Food Truck Tuesday events are below:

**June 5<sup>th</sup>:** Loki Miller Band, a recipient of the 2017 CAMMIE Award for 'Best Guitarist'

**Aug. 7<sup>th</sup>:** Off the Record, an 80's dance band

**Sept. 18<sup>th</sup>:** The Rockhounds, a classic rock band from Northern California ranging from the 1960's to contemporary, easy listening, soul, and country.

**Oct. 2<sup>nd</sup>:** Michelle Lambert, Indie/Pop Artist (Michelle Lambert is a Northern California Native).

The events will be heavily advertised on social media and posters will be displayed throughout town. I want to give a special thanks to the Paskenta Band of Nōmlakī Indians for sponsoring and organizing the music for the events.

#### **Agreement Extension with Waste Management:**

The City Council will consider a six month extension to the Franchise Collections Agreement at the next City Council meeting. The extension will allow the City to finalize negotiations.

#### **Water and Sewer Refinancing Annual Report:**

An annual report regarding the financial condition of the Water and Sewer funds is due by April 1<sup>st</sup>. As part of the report, City CPA Roy Seiler is calculating the necessary increase to water rates. Water rates have not increased since 2014. Initial calculations estimate a necessary rate increase of 4%.

#### **Planning Consultant:**

I further discussed contracting with the County to provide Planning Services to the City. At this time, the County Planning Director does not feel doing so would be in the best interest of her Department.

I sent out a survey to determine how other small Cities provide planning services and the associated cost. At this time I anticipate contracting with a Consultant due to a lack of need for a full-time employee. Based on the initial survey responses, the City can expect our rates to increase 300%.

### **PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:**

#### **Training Seminar:**

Public Works Director Dawn Grine will be attending the 2018 Public Works Officers Institute March 28-30, 2018 in Monterey. This seminar will provide valuable information for all aspects of Public Works and on City projects.

**Community Event:**

Saturday, March 31, 2018 from noon to 8 p.m. there will be a Family Music Festival & Easter Egg Hunt at Corning Community Park (Skateboard Park area). The event will include live local music, vendors and non-profit organizations. The music will consist of country, folk and light rock, all geared toward a family friendly environment.

**POLICE DEPARTMENT:**

**Patrol:**

In addition to responding to 223 calls for service, a total of 40 officer reports were taken and there were 133 officer-initiated incidents, including 46 traffic stops. Officers made 8 misdemeanor and 2 felony arrests. Officers issued 18 citations, of which; 7 were misdemeanors, 9 were infractions, and 2 were parking-related during the period of March 7, 2018 through March 14, 2018.

**Training:**

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. One Department Dispatcher attended a California CLETS User Group Training meeting this week. Other Officer Field Training and Dispatcher Training is continuing.

**Community:**

The Peace Officer Memorial Service will be held on Wednesday, May 16, 2018 at High Point Assembly Church in Red Bluff beginning at 7:00 p.m.

**FIRE DEPARTMENT:**

**Call Volume:**

Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 18 medicals, 1 fire and 1 traffic collision for a total of 20 incidents this past week. The Dispatch Center also dispatched 9 incidents for Orland and Capay Fire Departments last week.

**Training:**

On February 28<sup>th</sup>, training consisted of navigating through a building with full PPE's (Personal Protective Equipment) and an SCBA (Self Contained Breathing Apparatus) with the mask blacked out to simulate entry into a building.
