CITY MANAGER:

FY 2017/18 Budget:

Roy Seiler and I met on Thursday May 11th to continue work on the FY 2017/18 budget. I will also meet with HdL to discuss fourth quarter 2016 results and FY 2017/18 sales tax projections. HdL estimates the City will receive \$2.6 M up \$150K from FY 2016/17.

Sidewalk on 6th and Solano Street:

As a result of a complaint received regarding the lack of sidewalk on the west side of 6th Street near Solano Street, I met with the property owners to discuss installation of an approach, sidewalk, curb and gutter. The property owners agreed to install an approach, sidewalk, curb and gutter. This is good news, as this is the only arterial off Solano Street without sidewalk.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Water Leak Repair:

Late afternoon on May 10th Petro Travel Stop reported a main waterline leak located near their property on South Avenue. Public Works Crewmembers prepared the location and returned at 2am on May 12th to complete repairs. The repairs were completed in a timely manner with minimal water service interruption to the truck stop operation.

Corning Neighborhood Crime Watch:

At the September 27, 2016 City Council Meeting, Council authorized the Corning Neighborhood Crime Watch Program founder Colette Glattfelder to proceed with Crime Watch sign placement throughout the City. Sign installation requires an Encroachment Permit and a Certificate of Liability Insurance listing the City as the Additional Insured. Five signs are currently placed within the southwest section of town. Mrs. Glattfelder has contacted the Public Works Department and is preparing to install five signs within the southeast section of town on May 13, 2017.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 205 calls for service, a total of 37 officer reports were taken and there were 116 officer-initiated incidents, including 51 traffic stops. Officers made 5 misdemeanor arrests and 2 felony arrests. Officers issued 11 citations, of which; 7 were misdemeanors, 2 were infractions, 1 was parking-related, and 1 was animal-related during the period of May 3, 2017 through May 10, 2017.
