HOLIDAYS:

MEMORIAL DAY: Monday, May 29, 2017 City Hall, the Finance Department and the Corporation Yard will be closed.

CITY MANAGER:

FY 2017/18 Budget:

Roy Seiler and I met on Thursday May 25th to incorporate the Capital Improvement Plan into the proposed FY 2017/18 budget. The budget will be presented to the City Council at the June 13th City Council Meeting.

Proposition 64 _Adult Use of Marijuana Act (AUMA) Meeting

On May 30th at 6:00 PM there will be a meeting held at Woodson Elementary School to discuss the AUMA. Retail sales of marijuana and outdoor personal cultivation of marijuana will be the particular focus of the meeting. Staff will also present to the Council and the public a primer on the AUMA including the regulatory framework being developed, and taxation.

Meetings:

I attended the Tehama County Jobs Development Committee Meeting on May 25th. The County is working diligently to entice businesses to Tehama County. Specifically, they are creating an Economic Development (EDA) Zone along South Avenue. Planning Consultant, John Stoufer, and I will be working closely with the Tehama County Planning Department on the creation of the ADA Zone, as it is likely the City will annex in this area, if it is producing revenue for the City.

I also attended the Up IN Corning meeting on May 22nd. They will be working on a 'Pet Walk' through Downtown Corning along with helping to publicize the Farmers' Market.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Encroachment Permit:

MJ Shelton General Engineering, Inc. applied for an Encroachment Permit so that they may perform drain line replacement of portions of Bell Carter's olive waste drain lines located within the City Limits of Corning. They anticipate beginning this project on June 12th and should be completed within two weeks. Project Scope:

- 2nd Street between Marin and Yolo Streets
- Midblock 4th Street between North and Tehama Streets

Public Works Crewmember Wayne Jobe:

Wayne's last day of employment with the City of Corning will be June 2nd. I tried to talk him out of it, but as usual, my words fall on deaf ears! We will all miss him and we wish him the very best as he starts this next chapter of his life.

Public Works Crewmembers:

Effective May 30th, Public Works Crewmembers will be on summer hours of operation. Their work day will begin at 6:00 am and end at 2:30 pm. The Meter Reader/Maintenance Worker will continue his working hours of 8:00 am until 4:30 pm. Summer hours will end the first workday after Labor Day Weekend.

AirCon Energy:

Members of AirCon Energy were in Corning on May 25th performing an Energy Efficiency Audit of all City owned buildings. Director of Energy Services Andy Roth anticipates a 30-day turn around for savings findings within the City.

Corning Rest Area:

"The California Department of Transportation (District 2) will host a ribbon cutting ceremony for the newly completed Corning Safety Roadside Rest Areas (Lt. John C. Helmick Safety Roadside Rest Area) on May 31, 2017 at 10 a.m. at the southbound rest area. Construction began August 31, 2015 on the complete reconstruction of the facilities and landscaping. The rest areas were named in honor of Lt. John C. Helmick, a C.H.P. commander who was killed in a collision on SR 99 on February 27, 1989. The facilities, originally built in 1965, were re-opened to the public on Monday, May 8, 2017."

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 173 calls for service, a total of 30 officer reports were taken and there were 50 officer-initiated incidents, including 23 traffic stops.
