CITY MANAGER:

Solano Streetscape Project:

Pat Walker, John Stoufer and I met with Caltrans District 2 Local Assistance Staff on Monday afternoon to discuss our Solano Streetscape Project and fulfilling the requirements of Section 106 (National Historic Preservation Act). We did a brief summation of our project and left copies of the preliminary plans, Façade Improvement Plan and Streetscape Master Plans from 1999. We also provided copies of photographs and diagrams from our July 2013 PowerPoint Presentation. They were to review the information and then determine if we needed to supplement the information we've already provided to comply with Section 106 and NEPA.

College & Career Fair:

Mayor Strack has been asked to speak at the Maywood School College and Career Fair on December 4th. However, he will be out of town on that day and has asked me to speak to the 7th and 8th graders. The primary subject will be to relay personal experiences regarding my career. However, the Administrators have also asked if we could provide some information regarding the new park.

Park Ordinance:

We've been working with Mike Fitzpatrick to compile a comprehensive Park Ordinance that will reaffirm the Skate/bike park rules, consolidate other park rules and address some additional issues that we've recently identified. Mike is currently out of the country but will resume working on the Draft Ordinance upon returning.

County Landfill-Temporary Closure:

We received the following message from Kristina Miller on Thursday:
The Tehama County/Red Bluff Landfill is closed due to safety issues associated with high winds. We anticipate reopening the Landfill tomorrow during normal business hours 8:00 a.m. -4:30 p.m.

Lucero Olive Oil Winter Crush:

We received a letter from Chamber of Commerce President Terry Barbo informing that Lucero Olive Oil will conduct their "Winter Crush" event on Saturday December 14th from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. They've asked for our permission to designate Loleta Avenue as a one-way street during the event; as we've done in the past. They will utilize youth and civic organizations to assist with traffic direction and parking. Temporary parking and shuttle buses will also be provided at Love's Truck Stop. They'll offer tours of their mill, music performances, a vendor market, eateries and microbreweries. Last year the event attracted about 2,000 visitors. They expect that many or more this year and have asked the City to consider the Winter Crush to be a community event. The Winter Crush will attract a lot of out of town visitors and spotlight local products and vendors. That's a great thing for our community. I have asked Police Chief Don Atkins to have his Officers visit the event while it's occurring.

Development Impact Fees:

After the Council meeting on Tuesday, we've started working on the Resolutions and Staff Reports for updating the Development Impact Fees. We'll have them ready for the continued public hearing at the December 10th City Council meeting.

Burn Dump Meeting:

We've scheduled a meeting for December 4th at City Hall to discuss the former Burn-dump property and potential remediation activities. Representatives from the Tehama County Environmental Health Dept. (TCEHD), State Dept. of Toxic Substance Control (DTSC), CalRecycle and the State Regional Water Resources Control Board are expected to participate in the meeting. At this point CalRecycle has made some recommendations to TCEHD. At some point TCEHD may pass those recommendations onto the City for remedial action. The meeting is intended to be a scoping session that'll ideally facilitate coordination and cooperation among the various agencies.

Tehama County Transportation TAC Meeting:

On Thursday, November 21st, Patrick Walker (Public Works Director) attended the TAC meeting at the Tehama County Public Works Department in Gerber. The main focus for the City of Corning was to make sure that the Solano Street scape project will still be programmed for funding this upcoming year.

Christmas Banners and Trees:

Public Works will begin installing Christmas banners and trees on the first week of December. The banners will be installed on December 2nd and 3rd, and the trees will be placed on the light poles on December 4th. This is all in preparation for Hometown Christmas which will be on Saturday December 7th.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:**Patrol:**

In addition to responding to 185 calls for service, a total of 25 officer reports were taken and there were 49 officer-initiated incidents. Officers made 5 misdemeanor and 0 felony arrests, 14 traffic stops and issued 8 citations of which 5 were misdemeanors, 0 were felony, 2 were infractions, and 1 was a parking citation during the period of November 13, 2013 through November 20, 2013.






On December 14, 2013, Lucero Olive Oil will hold its third annual Winter Crush event. The family event which is billed as "A Day at the Mill" is held at 2123 Loleta Avenue from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm. In addition to the citrus crush and tours of the olive oil processing, the event will feature live music performances, a vendor market place highlighting local artisan producers, eateries and local microbreweries. Attendees will also have the opportunity to watch live cooking demonstrations hosted by local chefs. There will also be a kid's zone that will include the following activities: jewelry making, bag decorating, olive branch crowns and coloring.

Each year during the event, Loleta Avenue has been designated as a one-way street, between Highway 99W and Tomes Avenue, with limited on-site parking. Off-site parking has been provided at Love's Truck Stop and Linnet's Tires with TRAX shuttles to and from the event. At each event Lucero Olive Oil enlists the help of several youth and civic organizations and compensates the organizations with generous donations to their programs.

Last year the event drew nearly two thousand attendees and it is anticipated attendance this year will be greater, with attendees coming from throughout the north state. In addition to promoting olive oil production, the event promotes local food vendors, food related producers, and local microbreweries.

Due to the size of the event and the positive impact it has on the business community and the community overall, the Chamber of Commerce is requesting the City of Corning consider supporting the Winter Crush as a community event.
