CITY MANAGER:

Appeals Board Hearing:

Mr. Tim Schromm requested a postponement of the Appeals Board hearing that we'd scheduled for Friday November 20th, as his agent will be out of town. We have rescheduled that meeting for Monday, November 30th.

Application and Site Inspection at 2120 Solano Street:

We received a use permit application from Dignity Health for the site at 2120 Solano Street for a new medical building and ambulance staging site. The new building will be adjacent to the former Clark's Drug Store that's planned to be converted from retail space to medical use as well. After accepting the application, Planning Consultant John Stoufer, Public Works Director Dawn Grine, Building Official Terry Hoofard and I visited the site to view the driveway that the two buildings will share and the existing and proposed parking areas. The matter will be scheduled for Planning Commission review at their December 15th meeting.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Public Works Crew:

The Crew has been busy this week with leaf pick-up, hanging the holiday banners and Christmas tree trimming.

Community Events:

The Corning Chamber of Commerce/Hometown Christmas Committee has submitted its announcement to host their "Hometown Christmas" activities & parade on Downtown Solano Street. Solano Street between Fourth and Fifth Streets will be closed on Saturday, December 5th from noon until 5pm for daytime activities and Solano Street from Houghton Avenue through Second Street will be closed beginning at 5pm for the annual Christmas Parade. The lighting of the Christmas tree will follow immediately after the parade.

Public Works Director Meetings & Training:

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 252 calls for service, a total of 25 officer reports were taken and there were 72 officer-initiated incidents. Officers made 1 felony arrest and 11 misdemeanor arrests, 44 traffic stops and issued 21 citations of which 1 was a felony, 9 were misdemeanors, 6 were infractions, and 5 parking, during the period of November 18, 2015 – November 25, 2015.
