CITY MANAGER:

NCCSIF Meeting:

I attended the NCCSIF meeting on October 27th. The net position of NCCSIF increased by three million dollars from fiscal year 2014/15 to 2015/16.

Expect More Tehama:

Lisa Linnet attended the Expect More Tehama Summit at Rolling Hills Casino on October 27th.

Refinancing of City's Water and Sewer Debt:

S&P Global Ratings assigned its 'A-' long-term rating to the City of Corning, Calif.'s Series 2016 Sewer Revenue Refunding Bonds. A due-diligence conference call is scheduled for Monday, October 31st. The Bonds will be priced the week of November 17th, with closing scheduled for December 1st.

Kaufman Building:

The investigation regarding the cause of the Kaufman Building fire continues. Farmers' Insurance indicated they will not haul off the rubble until the investigation is complete. A timeframe of 30-60 days was given.

National Incident Management System (NIMS)/ Standardized Emergency Management System (SIMS) Training:

Fire Chief Martin Spannaus will be in charge of training all employees in NIMS/SEMS.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Corning Skate Park, 1485 Toomes Avenue:

North State Skate Series (NS3) Event Coordinator Kevin Marshall hosted an event at the Skate Park on October 22th. Kevin stopped by City Hall on Tuesday to let us know that the event went well and that there were no reported complaints.

Drainage Ditches:

Salt Creak Conservation Camp Crew Members have begun the annual cleaning of the Cities drainage ditches. Crew Members are typically not available until the end of fire season. They will clear brush and debris from the local streambeds of both Jewett and Burch Creeks and the Blackburn Moon Drain.

Bridge located on Hwy 99W:

There are two bridges located along Hwy 99W. The bridge nearest South Avenue (crossing Burch Creek) received guardrail damage from a single vehicle accident. Apex Fence Company, Inc. of Anderson, CA has been solicited to provide a cost to repair damages. Repairs will need to be completed as soon as possible.

Neighborhood Watch Program:

I will be meeting with Collette Glattfelder on October 27th to identify sign placement locations.

Pumpkin Carving Contest:

Building Official Dan Redding has organized a pumpkin carving contest for City Departments. We will have the pumpkins on display at City Hall on Monday during "Treat Street" which is sponsored by local business owners. Each child will be given a ticket so that they can vote for their favorite pumpkin. Bragging rights are on the line!

Clark Park Concession/Restroom Building:

Corning Little League submitted a final set of plans to the City on Monday, October 24th. The City Building Official and City Engineer have approved the plans with some minor alterations. Project Manager Luke Alexander has indicated that the Volunteers would like to begin construction of the foundation in early November.

Leaves:

It is still a little early yet, but we have been asked about leaf pick up throughout the City. The Public Works Department will not begin leaf pick up until the beginning of November unless Mother Nature dictates any earlier. POLICE DEPARTMENT:**Patrol:**

In addition to responding to 230 calls for service, a total of 37 officer reports were taken and there were 79 officer-initiated incidents, including 16 traffic stops. Officers made 9 misdemeanor arrests and 2 felony arrests. Officers issued 23 citations, of which; 13 were misdemeanors, 2 were infractions, and 8 were parking-related during the period of October 19, 2016 through October 27, 2016.
