PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Corning Community Park:

The restrooms were delivered on Monday. Power, electrical and sewer are now hooked up and working. Sod has been installed around the immediate perimeter of the skate park and is being irrigated. The rail fencing has been installed.

Cal Fire Salt Creek Conservation Camp:

Salt Creek Crews have finished removing Arundo from Jewett and Birch Creeks and are now working at cleaning up the Blackburn-Moon Drainage system.

Corning Union High School:

Public Works Director Patrick Walker met with High School Superintendent John Burch this week to further discuss the details of a possible Land Lease Agreement between the City and the High School District. This proposed Agreement would encompass a small area land across from the School to locate and install solar arrays to feed power to the school.

The needs and terms of the Agreement are still being discussed. When the Agreement is completed and has been reviewed by the City Attorney it will be presented to the Council for final approval.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 161 calls for service, a total of 40 officer reports were taken and there were 103 officer-initiated incidents. Officers made 13 misdemeanor and 6 felony arrests, 54 traffic stops and issued 26 citations of which 1 was a felony, 15 were misdemeanors, 4 were infractions, 4 were parking and 2 were animal-related during the period of September 25, 2013 through October 2, 2013.

Community:

The Police Department will be participating in the Drug Enforcement Agency's National Prescription Drug Take-Back Program on October 26, 2014 from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at the Corning Police Department. This is the 7th presentation of this National event in our community. This program is anonymous. All solid dosage pharmaceutical product and liquids in consumer containers will be accepted. Liquid products, such as cough syrup, should remain sealed in their original container and the caps should be sealed tightly to prevent leakage. Intra-venous solutions, injectibles, and syringes will not be accepted (due to the potential hazard posed by blood-borne pathogens) and illicit substances, such as marijuana and methamphetamine, are not accepted.

Failure to participate in 2 or more consecutive board of directors meetings without notification may result in termination of the appointment.

Region Alternate Representative:

The Region Alternate Representative serves to represent the interests of those member cities in their region on the Sacramento Valley Division Board of Directors when the Region

Representative is unable or unwilling to do so. Although not required, it is recommended that Alternates participate in Sacramento Valley Division Board of Directors meetings as often as possible.




