### **CITY MANAGER:**

#### **Impending Retirements:**

The City is anticipating a few retirements within the next few months. Staff will work diligently to fill the vacancies to cause the least disruption to the affected Departments.

#### **Food Truck Tuesday**

Food Truck Tuesday was very well received. Thank you to all who gave of their time and effort to support this event. We have an excellent group of City Staff who created and managed, participated with set-up and take-down, conducted public safety services, event development and management, etc. I am impressed with the leadership capacity within our City. Thank you all!

#### **City Managers' Meetings**

The Sacramento Regional City Managers Meeting will be held on September 28<sup>th</sup>. The City of West Sacramento is in the process of revitalizing the City through its remaining RDA funds, favorable tax sharing agreements with the County of Sacramento, and grants. I will be researching whether we can utilize any of the same grants for revitalization efforts within the City of Corning.

#### **Meeting with Waste Management:**

Waste Management and I will be meeting on October 5<sup>th</sup> regarding the franchise hauling agreement.

#### **Upcoming Meetings:**

- The next Corning Economic Development Action Committee is October 8<sup>th</sup>. The regional Economic Development Strategy meeting is October 12<sup>th</sup>.
- I will be meeting with Hinderliter de Llamas (HdL) regarding our latest sales tax results on October 9<sup>th</sup>.

### **PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:**

#### **Senior Center:**

Contractor Cleanrite-Buildrite informed the Public Works Director and Building Official that the metal roofing material will not be available until October 26<sup>th</sup>. The project will not be issued a project final until the roofing work is completely finished.

**Tree Trimming Contract:**

The tree trimming project was awarded to West Coast Arborists, Inc. (WCA) at the September 11<sup>th</sup> City Council Meeting. West Coast Arborists, Inc. has set a date of October 15<sup>th</sup> to begin the project.

**Community Event/Street Impact:**

- ❖ Saturday, October 6, 2018: Although there will be no road closures, please be aware that an event with large attendance is expected at the entire Corning Community Park (both Lennox Fields & Skate Park) which may impact ease of road access not only on Toomes Ave. and Houghton Ave., but the surrounding side streets as well.

**POLICE DEPARTMENT:**

**Patrol:**

In addition to responding to 190 calls for service, a total of 36 officer reports were taken and there were 116 officer-initiated incidents, including 58 traffic stops. Officers made 17 misdemeanor and 3 felony arrests. Officers issued 22 citations, of which; 18 were misdemeanors, and 4 were infractions during the period of September 26, 2018 through October 3, 2018.

**Personnel:**

The Department is continuing to accept applications for Police Dispatcher/Clerk. Tom Watson is still out on medical and CSO Robbins has returned on light-duty.

**Training:**

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other Officer Field Training and Dispatcher Training is continuing.

**Community:**

The Department has several members who will be participating in the upcoming *Tehama Tough Mud Run* on Saturday, October 13, 2018. **FIRE DEPARTMENT:**

**Call Volume:**

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 16 incidents last week. These consisted of: 9 medical aids, 1 mutual aid fire, 1 gas investigation, 1 police assist, 1 investigation, 1 traffic collision, and 2 public assists.

Orland Fire Department was dispatched to 7 calls for service; 2 medical aids, 4 fires and 1 hazardous material.

The Capay Fire Department was dispatched to 1 fire.

Training for the Corning Volunteer Fire Department consisted of testing 5" hose on Engine 14.
