CITY MANAGER:

City Water & Sewer Debt Service:

City Staff is continuing to work with Mark Northcross and Mike Meyers of NHA Advisors to complete the necessary documentation to move forward with the possible refinancing of the 1999 A&B, 2005 COP and 2005 USDA Water & Sewer Debt Service loans. NHA Advisors believe such action will save the City a significant amount of money without increasing the debt term. Staff hopes to have everything in place to bring to Council in October.

CITY CLERK:

CHAMBER OF COMMERCE CANDIDATES NIGHT:

On October 13th at 6 p.m. the Chamber of Commerce will host a "Candidates Night" at the Corning Veterans Memorial Hall on the northeast corner of Solano Street and Houghton Avenue. Please come and get to know your local Candidates.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Blackburn Moon Drain:

You may notice water flowing through Blackburn Moon Drain over the next few days. Two newly drilled Agriculture (AG) water wells are being flow tested. They are located off of Hwy. 99W north of the City. One well is within the City Limits and the other well is located outside of the City Limits in Tehama County.

Tree Trimming:

North Valley Tree Services will begin trimming City trees in the northwest quadrant of town on September 19th. This project should take about 3 weeks. The northwest quadrant area includes west of the railroad tracks and north of Solano Street. A community notice article has been forwarded to the Corning Observer.

Public Works Crew:

Thank you to Public Works Crewmembers Troy Grootveld, Del Braiser, Jeremy Mosher and Brett White who were called out on Saturday (9/10/16) to repair a main waterline in the alley near Meadowbrook between South and Center Streets.

Leaves:

It is still a little early yet, but we have been asked about leaf pick up throughout the City. The Public Works Department will not begin leaf pick up until the beginning of November unless Mother Nature dictates any earlier. The Public Works Department will place an announcement in both the Friday Notes and the Corning Observer.

Streetscape Project:

City Engineer Ed Anderson will be on vacation for the next two weeks. Once he returns, the Public Works Department will hold a public meeting where community members can attend and ask Streetscape Project related questions. The date and time will be announced at a later time.

The Streetscape Project is nearing its completion. The Contractor is currently working on areas of concern and making necessary repairs.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 211 calls for service, a total of 36 officer reports were taken and there were 53 officer-initiated incidents, including 21 traffic stops. Officers made 12 misdemeanor arrests and 1 felony arrests. Officers issued 12 citations, of which; 11 were misdemeanors, and 1 was a felony during the period of September 7, 2016 through September 14, 2016.
