CITY MANAGER:

City Manager Returns from Maternity Leave:

City Manager Kristina Miller is returning from maternity leave on Monday, October 10, 2016.

CITY CLERK:

CHAMBER OF COMMERCE CANDIDATES NIGHT:

On October 13th at 6 p.m. the Chamber of Commerce will host a "Candidates Night" at the Corning Veterans Memorial Hall on the northeast corner of Solano Street and Houghton Avenue. Please come and get to know your local Candidates.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Streetscape Update:

The upcoming agenda will have a staff report addressing the landscaped areas within the newly installed bulb outs. After reviewing the staff report, should any Council Member or Department Manger have any questions, or if you would like to a schedule a walk-through of the area of proposed action, please contact Public Works Director Dawn Grine at 530/824-7025.

Tree Trimming:

North Valley Tree Services began trimming City trees in the northwest quadrant of town on September 19th. This project should take about 3 weeks. The northwest quadrant area includes west of the railroad tracks and north of Solano Street. A community notice article has been forwarded to the Corning Observer.

Leaves:

It is still a little early yet, but we have been asked about leaf pick up throughout the City. The Public Works Department will not begin leaf pick up until the beginning of November unless Mother Nature dictates any earlier. The Public Works Department will place an announcement in both the Friday Notes and the Corning Observer

PG&E Announcement:

PG&E has informed the Public Works Department that they have scheduled a "Planned Electrical Service Interruption" at the corner of Solano and Edith to make repairs in a location near that intersection. The planned interruption is scheduled for October 3rd between 12:00 a.m. and 4:00 a.m. The traffic signal will blink red lights during that period of time.

Blackburn Well Project:

In June, City Council accepted a proposal from Durham Pump, Inc. to perform upgrades to the Blackburn Well pump and motor. This project has been delayed/suspended pending pump testing of the Butte Well. Towards the end of summer, Butte Well had difficulties remaining online with the Cities water system. The water well is currently being inspected for possible pump and motor issues. Traditionally, the Butte Well is only online (providing water to the Corning water system) during the summer months.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 224 calls for service, a total of 38 officer reports were taken and there were 80 officer-initiated incidents, including 37 traffic stops. Officers made 7 misdemeanor arrests and 2 felony arrests. Officers issued 18 citations, of which; 7 were misdemeanors, 5 were infractions, 3 were animal-related, 2 were parking-related, and 1 was unclassified during the period of September 14, 2016 through September 21, 2016.
