## **PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:**

### **Corning Community Park:**

The delivery of the new park restroom building has been delayed until Monday, Sept. 30<sup>th</sup>. If the restroom building is delivered on Monday, everything will still be on schedule for the tentatively scheduled Park Grand Opening on Oct. 19<sup>th</sup>. Next Tuesday, October 1<sup>st</sup>, the sod around the skate park area is to be installed.

### **Corning Community Park Phase II:**

Today at 3 p.m., Ed Anderson, John Stouffer and Patrick Walker will meet with Fish & Game to see what they will require from the City for Phase II of the Corning Community Park. The plans are to place a foot bridge across Jewett Creek. Fish & Game will determine what requirements are needed to make it happen.

### **Cal Fire Salt Creek Conservation Camp:**

Salt Creek Crews have removed the Arundo from the area around the old burn dump and on the west side of I-5 in Jewett Creek. They continue work in Jewett Creek, now on the east side of I-5 heading into town.

## **POLICE DEPARTMENT:**

### **Patrol:**

In addition to responding to 214 calls for service, a total of 46 officer reports were taken and there were 104 officer-initiated incidents. Officers made 12 misdemeanor and 7 felony arrests, 30 traffic stops and issued 31 citations of which 2 were felony, 17 were misdemeanors, 5 were infractions, 7 were parking during the period of September 18, 2013 through September 25, 2013.

### **Community:**

The Police Department's Car Seat Inspector participated in National Car Seat Check Day in Red Bluff on Saturday, September 21 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Thirty-eight seats were checked and 16 defective or expired seats were collected. Monthly classes are held in Red Bluff and low-cost seats are available in Corning. Seat check appointments are free and can be made by calling the Department at 824-7014.

Representative is unable or unwilling to do so. Although not required, it is recommended that Alternates participate in Sacramento Valley Division Board of Directors meetings as often as possible.
