CITY MANAGER:

School Resource Officer Agreement with Corning Union High School:

The School District has agreed to fund 50% of the cost of the School Resource Officer (including salary and benefits) as previous grant funding that funded this position has expired. City Attorney Jody Burgess is drafting the Agreement.

Food Truck Tuesday –October 3rd:

Food Truck Tuesday will be held on October 3rd in Downtown Corning. Food Trucks, Crafts, and Mexican Dancers will be present at the event. The Fire Department is donating tables and chairs for the event. City Councilman Chuy Valerio coordinated the entertainment for the event.

Senior Center:

Fire cleanup in the kitchen and main hall areas is completed and the Center will reopen next Monday, October 2nd. City Staff is working with the City's Insurance Claims Adjuster in regards to the Centers storage area where the most damage occurred. In the meantime, this area has been blocked off and will remain closed until all repairs are completed and it can be safely utilized.

Community Event/Street Impacts:

OLIVE FESTIVAL:

- **Tuesday, October 3, 2017:** Solano Street will be closed between Third & Sixth Streets from 4 p.m. – 9 p.m.
- **Friday, October 6, 2017:** Solano Street from Houghton Avenue to Third Street will be closed from 4:30 p.m. - 6:30 p.m. Staging for the cruise will occur on Marin St. & staging for the parade will occur on Yolo St.
- **Saturday, October 7, 2017:** Although there will be no road closures, please be aware that an event with large attendance is expected at the entire Corning Community Park (both Lennox Fields & Skate Park). This may impact ease of road access not only on Toomes and Houghton Avenues, but the surrounding side streets as well.

Corning Chamber of Commerce:

Chamber Director JC Pendergraft has informed Public Works that the Chamber Board will be discontinuing the hanging of Christmas Trees along Solano Street this year and will be purchasing new banners. The new banners will be displayed along Solano Street between Marguerite and Edith Avenues. The Chamber plans to host a Christmas Tree decorating contest amongst the local merchants.

Tehama County Groundwater Sustainability Agency Groundwater Commission (GSAGC):

Eleven interested stakeholders (including the City of Corning) met on September 27th for a regular monthly meeting. Commissioners must continue to move forward to comply with the State mandated requirement to develop regulations pertaining to the development of a Groundwater Sustainability Plan (GSP) by January 1, 2022.

The California Department of Water Resources (DWR) has released the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA) Grant Proposal Package which details the application requirement and submittal period which closes on November 13th. The Tehama County GSAGC would be eligible for and can apply for up to 1.5 million dollars that would help fund the planning and development of its Groundwater Sustainability Plan. Tehama County Flood Control/Water Resources Manager Ryan Teubert intends to present the draft application to the Commission at the October 25th regular meeting.

Leaves:

Leaf pick up begins in early November unless Mother Nature dictates any earlier.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:**Patrol:**

In addition to responding to 197 calls for service, a total of 30 officer reports were taken and there were 76 officer-initiated incidents, including 32 traffic stops. Officers made 4 felony and 9 misdemeanor arrests. Officers issued 25 citations, of which; 13 were misdemeanors, 2 were felony, 8 were infractions, and 2 were parking-related during the period of September 20, 2017 through September 27, 2017.

Vehicle Abatement:

For the month of September, private property statistics are as follows: 24 letters were sent, 0 vehicles towed, 37 vehicles corrected by owner.
