**3. Update on Recreation Programs:**

Recreation Supervisor Kimberly Beck informed the Commissioners that the Spring Programs are winding down and the summer planning will begin. While looking into the future months, the Recreation Department was advised to minimize programs such as the Slow Pitch Softball Leagues. All Softball team managers were sent letters informing them that the Corning Recreation Department will no longer be the administrator of both the Men's Slow Pitch Softball League and the Co-ed Slow Pitch Softball League.

Red Cross will attend the next Recreation Commission Meeting and will be asking community members to attend in order to integrate Red Cross Programs into Tehama County.

Kim updated the Commission about budget cuts that could potentially happen in the near future. Assistant Director of Public Works Carl Crain added information regarding the City Pool.

**4. Update on Proposition 84 Grant Application:**

After months of hard work and the combined efforts from Eihnard Diaz, JoAnne Anders, Ed Andersn, John Stoufer, Kimberly Beck, John Brewer, and Carl Crain, Kim was pleased to announce that the City delivered the grant application before the filing deadline and are confident that the grant will give the evaluators a good sense of our Community and the need for a new park.

**5. Update from the Skate and Bike Park Association:**

John Richards updated the Recreation Commission informing them that the Skateboarders have been asked by the Principal of Olive View Elementary School to perform a demonstration at the schools' carnival. Jessie Orduno also would like the skateboarders to organize and compete in a competition during the local May Madness event. Mr. Richards informed the Commission that they are looking into liability insurance. Commissioner Lauderdale stated that Rotary provides the liability coverage for the parade and suggested that Mr. Richards meet with Tony Cardenas, Steve Kimbough and himself to discuss whether the Rotary policy could cover the Skateboarders as well.
