1. Waive the Reading and Approve the Minutes of the March 6, 2012 Recreation Commission meeting with any necessary corrections.

Commissioner Copely moved to approve the Minutes of the March 6, 2012 Recreation Commission Meeting. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion. **Ayes: Lauderdale, Johnson, Smith and Copley. Opposed/ Abstain: None. Absent: Shoemaker. Motion was approved by a 4-0 vote with Shoemaker absent.**

2. Discuss options and process for naming the new City Park, possible recommendation to City Council.

Assistant Public Works Director Patrick Walker stated that the City has agreed to name a portion of the Park after Dorothy Harper, longtime resident and former owner of the property on which a large portion of the Park is being constructed.

By consensus of the Commissioners, the Commission recommends to the City Council for the City to approach each of the Corning Schools with the possibility of them holding a "Name the New City Park" Contest. Each class in each School could come up with a proposed Park name. The individual Schools would then narrow it down to one proposed Park name per School. City Staff and the Recreation Commission could also come up with a proposed Park name. All of these could then be submitted to the City Council for final selection.

The Recreation Commission requested to have on the next Agenda, to discuss and possibly act on, initiating a program in which, at each meeting a representative from one of the active sports organizations (i.e. Little League, Swim Team, etc.) in the City would attend the meeting and provide the Recreation Commission with a report of what they are doing.
