2. Update on Recreation Programs.

Recreation Supervisor Kimberly Beck informed the Commission about the upcoming activities. The Photo Class currently has six participants registered. The class will begin this Thursday, January 7th at 6pm in the City Council Chambers. Bob McConnell who has a passion for photography and has earned several awards for his work is teaching the class.

Kenpo Karate has changed from two days a week to four days a week. The class is held Monday through Thursday at 5:30pm in the Woodson Elementary Gymnasium.

The Take it to the Dance Floor Line Dance class began tonight in the West Street School Multipurpose Room. The class has 18 participants and is taught by long-time dance instructor Michele Burton. It will continue for 7 more weeks.

Youth Basketball has 52 participants registered. The kids begin this Saturday at 9am in the Maywood Gymnasium. The program will utilize the help of about 16 high school volunteers and the program will continue each Saturday through February 20th.

Yoga will begin tomorrow at 6pm in the Olive View Gymnasium. Tammy Lambeth will be instructing again.

Volleyball Open Gym will begin on Monday January 11th at 7pm in the Corning Union High School South Gym. The admission fee is \$1 per person per session.

Men's Basketball League looks like it will be cancelled. We had a great turnout the first time we ran the League. However, since then, we have had a tough time getting people to register teams. Part of it might be because there are other open gym type leagues people can play in for free.

3. Park Planning and Land Acquisition.

Kim updated the Recreation Commission about the progress that is being made regarding Proposition 84. John Stoufer is working on the environmental document (CEQA) with a qualified professional. The last community meeting will be held on January 12th at the West Street School Multipurpose Room at 5:30pm. Participation in these meetings is critical to the project. Commissioner Lauderdale recommended that the Recreation Department host a Chamber Mixer to receive more attendance. The appraisals should be done by Friday, which means we will start negotiations on Monday. John Stoufer and Kim will meet with the Grant Writer JoAnne Anders this Thursday to start the application.

Commissioner Turner updated the Recreation Commission about the Corning Skate and Bike Park Committee. The Committee raised about \$800 from their raffle. They are planning on having a Taco Feast on either April 10th or 17th. Kim asked if the Committee had started applying for any grants. Commissioner Turner said not yet.
