3. Review City Park Use & Fee Policies.

b. Leaving the current structure intact and remodeling the existing restrooms utilizing the storage space that is currently being occupied by the Corning Little League as "concession storage".

Little League President Jason Libby entered the discussion and noted that the hot water heater is leaking. Commission Members requested that the City Staff continue to investigate both options for the Clark Park restrooms and choose the option most appropriate for the needs of the Community. They then requested to be kept apprised of all progress in relation to this project.

SUMMARY:

Staff recommends increases to the fees charged for use of the City Pool in Northside Park. The fee increase is recommended to offset the annual costs for City pool maintenance and operations which includes chemical supplies and guard wages.

A fee increase was last approved by Corning City Council on May 26, 2009. Staff has prepared a fee comparison of surrounding area public pools. The fee comparison and proposed rates are attached for your review.
