D. REGULAR AGENDA:

1. Waive the Reading and Approve the Minutes of the December 1, 2009 Recreation Commission meeting with any necessary corrections:

Commissioner Lauderdale moved to approve the Minutes of the January 5, 2010 Recreation Commission Meeting as written. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion. **Ayes: Price, Johnson, Lauderdale, and Turner. Opposed: None. Absent: Boles. Motion was approved by a vote of 4-0.**

2. Report on Winter Recreation Activities:

Recreation Supervisor Kimberly Beck informed the Commission about the progress of the winter activities. Our kids' classes such as Mommy N' Me and Music in Motion were schedule to begin 3 weeks ago. However, since the Café was rented, we are looking for an alternative spot. We are unable to use any of the school facilities during school hours therefore we are very limited.

Youth Flag Football has been postponed. Last year there were around forty participants. This year we only have about 15 registrations. We are going to give the community another week to register. Hopefully, we can get enough kids to make the program successful.

The Rain or Shine Tournament was cancelled due to lack of registration. Kim spoke about the disgruntled team managers who are opposed to the new fees for this year's softball season.

Commissioners discussed the CPR class and whether it includes First Aid Training. Kim is going to double check with the instructor of the class, Danielle Caito.

3. Update on Proposition 84:

Kim gave the Recreation Commissioners maps of the new proposed park area (see attached). Kim updated the Commission about the progress that has been made. Hopefully, the grant application will be completed within the next 2 weeks.

4. Report from the Skateboard Park Association:

Commissioner Turner reported that the Association is positive but feels like they are on hold because of Proposition 84. The Association will provide a presentation to the City Council on February 9th. It was announced that the Taco Feed dates have been changed. It was reported that the Association is still waiting for the Federal I. D. Number, without it they are unable to

approach places like the local Casino. The raffle reportedly earned between five hundred and six hundred dollars.

Kim asked Commissioner Turner who would make the Skate and Bike Park Association presentation at the City Council Meeting. Commissioner Johnson recommended that if an Association representative is not able to make a presentation, a representative should at least be prepared to give a progress report to the Council. Carl Crain said that this would show the Council that the Association hasn't lost momentum. Kim said she will contact John and Madaline to make sure the Association is prepared.

5. Shannon Boles gave her formal resignation on February 2nd, 2010. At the next Commission meeting, the Commission will vote on a new Chair and hopefully welcome a new Commissioner.
