Recreation Supervisor Kimberly Beck updated Mr. Zamansky and the Commission about the teams that will be using Yost Park such as soccer, men's slow pitch softball, coed softball and the Maywood Fast Pitch Team.

6. High School Recreation Activities Survey – Discussion:

Nearly 800 Students have completed the CUHS Survey. The Class is now working on coding the surveys in order to analyze the data and present the results to the Recreation Commission, City Council and the CUHS Board. The Class is also adjusting the Survey to make it appropriate to disperse to the Maywood and Richfield 7th and 8th graders. **No action necessary – discussion only.**

7. Discussion of Certificates of Appreciation:

Kim informed the Commission that Certificates of Appreciation are going to be given to the Instructors and Volunteers who have assisted the Corning Recreation Department. The Commission decided that they would like to put the Recreation Chairperson's signature and the Mayor's signature on the certificates. The Instructors and Volunteers will be invited to the February Recreation Commission Meeting to be recognized.
