

A. CALL TO ORDER: 7:30 p.m. by Acting Chairperson Boles.

B. ROLL CALL:

Chairperson:	Craig Purcell

Commissioners present: Boles, Price, Johnson and Lauderdale. Commissioners Absent: Purcell.

C. BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR: None.

D. REGULAR AGENDA:

1. Waive the Reading and Approve the Minutes of the September 2, 2008 Recreation Commission meeting with any necessary corrections.

Commissioner Price motioned approval of the September 2, 2008 Recreation Commission Meeting Minutes. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion. **Ayes: Boles, Price, Johnson and Lauderdale. Opposed: None. Absent: Purcell. Abstain: None. Motion approved by a vote of 4-0 with Purcell absent.**

2. High School Recreation Activities Survey – Discussion.

After a summary and discussion by the Recreation Supervisor, she stated she would be working with the Recreation Class at Corning High School to construct, disperse, and track results of the High School Survey. She also said they hope to obtain more accurate results by having students create the survey. Recreation Supervisor Kim Beck also informed the Commission that they hope to extent the survey to Maywood Middle School. When asked when this task would be complete, Kim replied that they hope to be finished before the year's end.

3. Update on Recreation Programs.

Recreation Supervisor Kim Beck informed the Commission that the most successful programs are Tumbling, Mommy N' Me, and Karate. Karate is still growing with over 50 youth participants. The Tumbling class is starting a new session immediately after the first session is completed due to customer demand. Kim stated that the Mommy N' Me class has become a club that stay-at-home Moms are enjoying just as much as their kids. The group has created play dates, lunches, and other fun activities. Kim stated the class is free and is now being held at Deb Meents's Dance Studio behind the Veteran's Hall. Kim informed the Commission that programs that have future opportunities are scrapbooking, which will continue being offered once a month, and knitting which will be tried at a different time of year. The next activity offered is the wrestling camp for 5th through 8th graders instructed by Cort Mitchell. Kim stated that she had requested this activity be added to Maywood School's bulletin. Commissioner Price suggested sending an electronic version of the flyer to all the middle schools; Kim said she would do that.

4. Report on meeting with Elementary School District Superintendent Stephen Kelish.

Kim reported that she had a great meeting with Stephen Kelish and Steve Kimbrough that included a variety of discussion topics and a tour of Maywood Middle School. Kim encouraged the Commissioners to visit the school if they haven't done so yet. She stated that they have made improvements including a new gymnasium, a themed cafeteria, library improvements, smart classrooms, and language barrier classes. She stated Steve Kelish is an asset to the Recreation Department and an activist for youth recreation. Kim informed the Commission that Steve Kelish emphasized his continuing support for the Recreation Department.

Among other topics discussed at the meeting, was Mr. Kelish's particular interest in the Theatre with discussion of a possible Joint Use Agreement for the use of the Theatre between the City and the Elementary School District. Kim stated this was just at the talking stage now, however it is a foot in the right direction. Commissioner Lauderdale then updated the Commission on the Theatre's progress.

5. Update on Purchase of New Woodson Park Playground Equipment and New Fountains for City Parks.

This item was postponed until next meeting when Assistant Public Works Director Carl Crain will be present to update the Commission on the installation progress.

Commissioner Boles asked that the Commission not turn community members away if they have ideas for the Recreation Commission. The Commissioners agreed to welcome patrons to the meetings with their ideas.

Commissioner Johnson asked Recreation Supervisor Kim Beck if she had received a copy of the City's Standard Operating Practice (SOP) or Employee Handbook. Kim stated she had received a Personnel Rules and Regulations pamphlet. Commissioner Johnson requested this topic be discussed with Carl Crain and Steve Kimbrough.

Audience member Harry Zemansky asked about the various programs operated by the Recreation Department.

SUMMARY:

Woodson Park Playground Equipment:

At the October 14, 2008 City Council Meeting, City Staff will be seeking Council's acceptance of the Playgrounds by Design, Inc. proposal at \$22,205.69 for the purchase of one set of the "Summit Crest" Playground Equipment and rubber matting for Woodson Park. In the 2008/09 City Budget, \$25,000 was allocated for this equipment.

At the same meeting, Staff will also seek authorization for an additional expenditure of \$2,794.31 to install concrete curbing and assessible path around the perimeter of the Woodson Park playground equipment area. This additional funding request will utilize the remaining allocated funds for Woodson Park Improvements. The installation of the curbing and path will be performed by the Ward's Concrete under an existing contract with the City.

Purchase and Installation of Seven (7) New Drinking Fountains in City Parks:

New drinking fountain locations and types are as follows:

Northside Park: There will be two new ADA approved Free Standing Pedestal Fountains added to the Park. One single bowl (410 WM) to be located at the new restrooms by the pool, and 1 double bowl (440 WM) by the tennis/basketball courts. **Total cost for these including tax and shipping is approximately \$4,058.10** and funding will be provided from the Park Improvement Fund that was allocated for Northside Park.


Edith Park & Woodson Park: One each, ADA approved wall mounted single bowl Drinking Fountain (450 WM). Approximate cost for both is \$2,200.

Flournoy Park & Yost Park: One each, ADA approved Free Standing Pedestal Double Bowl Fountains (440WM). Approximate cost for both is \$3,800.

Clark Park: One ADA approved Free Standing Pedestal Single Bowl Drinking Fountain (410 WMSS) at an approximate cost of \$1630. **Total cost for these remaining five (5) Park Drinking Fountains including tax and shipping is approximately \$9,118.98 and it will be funded from the 2008/09 Parks Budget.**

SUMMARY:

The City's Fiscal Year 2007-2008 Budget includes \$25,000 for playground equipment for Woodson Park. The equipment purchased is meant to replace an older "kid propelled" carousel. Staff recommends purchasing the apparatus and rubber matting shown on the attached photograph and proposal. The recommended apparatus includes slides, climbing equipment and other amusements that children between the ages of 5 and 12 should enjoy.

BACKGROUND:

Staff sought proposals from a number of playground equipment purveyors. The equipment that each supplier provides is somewhat unique, making direct comparison impractical. To sort through the varying proposals, we first determined that we were replacing a "merry-go-round", which we consider an "amusement" as opposed to an "exercise" feature. Therefore, our priority was to acquire equipment that would be fun for kids, ages 5-12, to experience. The attached spreadsheet summarizes the bid proposals and includes the additional cost anticipated for concrete curbing to surround the play area. I've also attached some of the photographs of the equipment packages.

While a number of the proposals would fit within the budget and would meet the "fun test", staff recommends the purchase of the "Summit Crest" model apparatus offered by Play and Park Structures. We also recommend the color be the "Northwoods" theme, which is green and earthtones. We believe that color scheme will best fit Woodson Park, with its numerous trees.

RECREATION COMMISSION:

Carl Crain presented the proposals to the Recreation Commission on September 2, 2008. The commissioners reviewed the proposals and do not object to the staff recommended equipment. However, one commissioner did prefer that the City opt for "exercise" focused equipment.

FINANCIAL:

Fiscal Year 2008/09 budgeted \$25,000 for Woodson Park equipment. The projected finished cost, including the equipment, rubber matting, taxes and shipping, and concrete perimeter curbing, is \$24,318, below that which is appropriated. within Fund No. 001-9171-6100.

The attached spreadsheet anticipates expending \$2112 for perimeter concrete curbing. That amount will fund 128 feet of curb at \$16.50/linear foot. However, we also know we'll need to provide a "handicapped accessible" path through the curb and into the equipment area. We don't currently know just how much that'll cost. For that reason, staff recommends Council approve a maximum expenditure of up to \$2,794.31 (the remainder of the appropriated \$25,000) for the accessory concrete work. That will provide up to \$682.31 (\$2,794.31-\$2,112.00) for the handicapped accessible path concrete work.




